






GENERAL ENGLISH PROGRAMME

The General English Programme has been carefully created for students wishing to develop their English in a relaxed, friendly atmosphere. They develop fluency and accuracy in their Speaking and Writing skills.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Practice of grammatical structures and different types of language for different situations in real life. Practice is carried out in different ways such as pair work and role plays. Additionally, students focus and practise pronunciation paying attention to articulation, intonation and word or sentence stress.

COURSES

ACADEMIC YEAR PROGRAMME
(25 WEEKS' TUITION + 8 WEEKS' HOLIDAY)

The Academic Year Programme is specifically designed for Non EU/EEA students who wish to follow a 25-week full-time programme in English. Students are allowed to stay in Ireland for an 8-month period, may work part-time for up to 20 hours per week during their studies and take the opportunity to travel and work in Ireland during their holiday period.

REQUIREMENTS

Students need to register and take recognized exams (e.g., TIE, Cambridge, IELTS). Before GNIB registration, pay the exam fee to the school for later use. When GNIB registration opens, the school will register students for the exam. Valid medical insurance is required; students can get accepted coverage through LLC for GNIB (IRP) approval.

PREPARATION PROGRAMMES IELTS AND CAMBRIDGE EXAMS

The preparation courses focus on examination techniques, developing reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills to achieve the required band score.

TRACK YOUR PROGRESS

A1 level learners can use basic expressions and ask simple questions. A2 involves communicating in everyday situations and describing surroundings. B1 allows understanding familiar topics and basic writing. B2 enables understanding complex texts, fluent communication, and detailed writing. C1 proficiency involves fluency in diverse contexts, while C2 signifies a high level of precision in complex situations and effortless comprehension of extensive information.

ACCOMMODATION

We have three options for your stay in Limerick: a Student Apartment, a Host Family, or a City Host. Spending a few weeks with a host family or city host is the best introduction to Ireland. They will make you feel welcome in their home, providing you with an opportunity to practice English throughout your stay. Most hosts live in the suburbs of Limerick, just a 10min to 20min bus ride or a 20min to 40min walk from the city centre and school.

If you prefer more independent living, we also offer student apartments at Grove Island. It's a student village that accommodates students in four and five-bedroom apartments.

HOST FAMILY ACCOMMODATION INCLUDES:

- Laundry facilities
- A comfortable bedroom, cleaned weekly
- A desk in the room or a quiet area elsewhere in the house to study
- Access to a shower or bath once a day and towels
- Wi-Fi or internet access



CITY HOST ACCOMMODATION INCLUDES:

- Self-catering
- Single or shared room as required (shared bathroom)
- Shared living facilities with the owner
- Laundry facilities | Bed linen is provided (towels not included)
- A desk in the room or a quiet area elsewhere in the house to study
- Wi-Fi or internet access



STUDENT APARTMENT INCLUDES:

- Single en-suite bedroom with a desk (bedroom including shower & toilet)
- Fully-equipped kitchen for self-catering
- Access to laundry facilities in Student Village (small fee per use)
- Bed linen is provided (but not towels or toiletries)
- Electricity, Wi-Fi, water and waste disposal included in price
- Wi-Fi or Internet access



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Course Book Policy

Students are responsible for purchasing and bringing the required course book to class. Students must have the required course book in order to attend class.

Book Exchange and Returns

Books may be exchanged only when a student changes level. All exchanges must be arranged through Reception in the OC Building. A refund of €10 may be issued where applicable, provided all conditions below are met.

Care of Course Books

To be eligible for an exchange or refund:

The book must be in good condition
Only pencil may be used in the book
All pencil markings must be fully erased before the book is returned
Books with pen, highlighter, damage, or markings will not be accepted
If these conditions are not met, no refund or exchange will be processed.



Assessment

Students are assessed at the end of each week across a range of language skills, including speaking, listening, reading, writing, grammar, and vocabulary.

Students receive regular feedback to help them understand their progress, recognise strengths, and identify areas for improvement.

Punctuality and Code of Conduct

We are here to support your learning and progress. Students are expected to take responsibility for their learning by arriving on time and attending all classes in full.

Students must:

Arrive on time and remain in class for the full session
Speak English only within the school building
Bring the required course book and necessary materials to every class
Treat teachers, staff, and classmates with respect at all times
Late arrival, early departure, repeated absence, or inappropriate behaviour will be followed up in line with School policy and may affect attendance records. Disrespectful or disruptive behaviour is not acceptable and may result in removal from class.



Request for Change of Level

If you feel that your class level is not right for you, please speak with your teacher first. Your teacher is the main and most important point of reference and will review your progress and suitability for the level.

If you are not satisfied after speaking with your teacher, you may submit a Request for Change of Level through the Student Portal.

Once a request is submitted, the Academic Director will:

Review your placement test results and ongoing progress
Consider feedback from your current teacher
Arrange an interview or observation with a teacher from the proposed level, if appropriate
Use all available information to make a final level change decision
Please note that level changes are made carefully to ensure the best learning outcome for all students.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Complaints and Grievances

Students are encouraged to submit any complaint in writing using the Student Feedback Form, available through the Student Portal or by request from reception.

Complaints may also be submitted by email to info@llcentre.ie.

All complaints are treated confidentially and addressed promptly. A decision will be reached within two weeks of receipt. Complaints may be handled by the Operations Director or the Student Liaison Officer, as appropriate.

Students are expected to read and follow the Student Handbook, which is available on the Student Portal. It is the student's responsibility to be familiar with School policies and procedures.
